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## Ts panchayat raj act pdf

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Hyderabad: The State Government is all set to focus on the effective implementation of the new Panchayat Raj Act and the new Municipal Act for the comprehensive development of rural and urban areas, respectively. As a result, the finance department allocated 23,005 r.c. for the Panchayat Raj and Rural Development department, as well as another 14,809 crore rs department for municipal administration and urban development for the financial year 2020-21. Presenting the state budget in the Assembly here on Sunday, Finance Minister T Harish Rao said the state government was implementing a comprehensive rural policy to change the rural way of life in the state. He said the new Panchayat Raj was adopted in an attempt to turn Gram Panchayats into dynamic agents in rural development. He pointed out that, following the implementation of the Palle Praguethi programme in two stages, people came to know the power of unity. As part of Palle Praguethi, the plans were prepared with public participation throughout the state. The necessary measures have been taken to ensure a tractor, a nursery, a crematorium and a warehouse in each village. I am proud to announce that these facilities are not available in any other state in India except Telangana until now. As part of Palle Praguethi, Haritha Plans was also prepared, he said. He said efforts were on to build model villages with commitment and inspiration from Palle Praguethi. To strengthen Gram Panchayats, the state government will directly release appropriate funds. The State Government shall provide corresponding funds equivalent to the funds provided by the Government of the Union and the funds of the Finance Commission. In addition to allocating Rs 65 crore to the material component each month under MGNREGS, the state government has also taken work to establish CC roads in villages at an expense of Rs 600 crore. Municipal Administration With accelerated urbanization in the state, the government focuses on the planned growth of urban centers. By effectively implementing the new Municipal Act, the state government wants to remove constraints and achieve transparency in the functioning of municipalities. Starting with this financial year, efforts shall be made to implement the self-declaration method to estimate property values. The state government will also implement the TS-BPass system to give permission for construction in an easy way, on the lines of the TS-IPASS system. Regarding the implementation of the Pattana Praguethi programme, Harish Rao stated that the objective was environmental coverage, sanitation and the promotion of development in a planned way in cities. He announced that the state government had decided to build public toilets government land to overcome the problem of land availability and to ensure the construction of

adequate public toilets in many urban areas over the next three months. In addition to taking over the development of several public facilities, the state government decided to establish separate areas for the parking of cars, taxi drivers and street vendors in order to carry out their work and avoid any inconvenience for the inhabitants. The state government will be releasing Rs 148 crore each month for the development of urban areas. The Minister announced the allocation of Rs 800 crore for development under the urban mission Bhagiratha system in the remaining 38 municipalities. In what appears to be a case of good intentions with unpleasant results, the government that makes Panchayat secretaries responsible for collecting all taxes under the Telangana Panchayat Raj Act-2018 has caused problems for both officials and taxpayers. Officials shall be deemed to be removed from office if they do not collect taxes. This forced Panchayat secretaries to go all the way to making people pay taxes. They are bothering the poor in the villages to pay the house tax immediately and even threatening them by saying that their names will be removed from the list of Aasara beneficiaries. Recently, Secretary Panchayat of Karangate village in Vikarabad district, Y Ananda Rao, was in front of the post office where pensioners came to get their pension and asked them to pay taxes. He threatened to ensure their names were removed from the pension list if they did not immediately pay the taxes. While about 10 people paid taxes on the spot fearing the consequences, several others, irritated by the official's attitude, organized a dharna. Only after local leaders intervened on the issue, the villagers withdrew their protest. Speaking to the Express, Ananda Rao said there is immense pressure on them to collect taxes. However, he denied sitting in front of the post office to collect the fees. I went around the village and taxes from people who have received their pension, he said. Meanwhile, the Vice-President of the Forum for Good Governance, Rao Chelican, said that the government that makes bureaucrats responsible for collecting taxes is a good idea. Three-quarter of income comes from urban areas. Almost half of the revenue collected is spent on rural development. To make local governing bodies sustainable, tax collection is important. Such a mechanism should be put in place to provide better services to people, he said. However, because some officers threaten people with removing their names from the list of social assistance schemes, awareness should be created in villages about the importance of paying taxes on time.
